On Wednesday, April 8, 2020, the RCSD Board of Trustees approved the RCSD 2019-2020 School Closures Related to COVID-19 Accreditation/Board Policy Suspensions and Revisions, which include the grading and promotion procedures found below.

In closing, one of our main focus points for our educators and students during the 2019-2020 school year has been having a "growth mindset". A growth mindset unlocks our ability to learn and grow especially during challenging times. Little did we know how important this growth mindset would be for all of us this year! Because of this experience and our growth mindset, I believe we all will be stronger when we come out on the other side of the COVID-19 Pandemic! History is being written! We hold the pen! Together, we will write the BEST story for our children!

RCSD Elementary Grading and Promotion Procedures for Distance Learning

- The purpose of both the online and technology-free assignments is to provide continuous educational opportunities and practice for students while schools are closed.
- During the school closure, teachers will provide distance learning assignments created by the Elementary Curriculum Department and/or teachers through both online and technology-free access.
- Lessons will be assigned weekly. Lessons will be provided through Google Classroom and/or Zoom for those with technology access. Technology-free alternative lessons/assignments will be available through each school site with telephone support from the teacher as needed.
- Assignments will not reflect negatively on the student's academic record but can improve your yearly average.
- Students can earn up to 10 points to be added to their yearly average by completing the distance learning assignments. (See Elementary Grading Procedures chart below.)
- A Zoom Parent/Guardian Consent and Release for Video/Audio Conferencing during COVID-19 School
 Closure Form will be sent to each parent via technology or paper copy to be signed before a student can
 participate in a video/audio instruction.
- Online assignments will be monitored and recorded weekly. Timely feedback should be given on any assignment completed, but grades will not be assigned or recorded. **COMPLETE or INCOMPLETE will be assigned.**
- Students will be provided ample time to complete assignments.
- All technology free assignments (paper copies) will be collected when students return and checked for completion. Again, please keep all completed assignments to be turned in when school resumes or on a date designated by the principal.

- Completion of distance learning assignments in Grades K-2 will be used as evidence to support promotion or retention.
- Completion of distance learning assignments in Grades 3-6 will provide students with the opportunity to earn up to 10 points to be added to the yearly average for the 2019-2020 academic year. (See Elementary Grading Procedures chart below.)

Elementary Promotion/Retention Guidelines

- The RCSD Guidance for Elementary Retention 2019-2020 and the Parent/Teacher/Administrator Consent Form will be provided to aid in the determination of promotion or retention for the 2019-2020 school year. (see chart below)
- Meetings with the parents to discuss promotion/retention should occur between May 4, 2020 and May 21, 2020.
- Note: Special Education Students: Promotion and grading should be the same for special education students as for
 general education students, given that accommodations and modifications have been provided for graded
 assignments during school closures related to the COVID-19 pandemic. If accommodations and modifications cannot
 be provided, grading and promotion should be determined on an individual basis at the local school level.
- **Note: EL Students**: Students who have not reached proficiency (Level 4 or Level 5) on the English language proficiency test will not be retained, as per MDE guidelines.

Elementary Promotion and Retention Procedures

Kindergarten	 Students in Kindergarten will be promoted to the next grade level if they have attained 70% mastery of the standards (denoted by an S or N) in English/Language Arts (ELA) and Math for the year. Students mastering less than 70% of the standards will be retained if a consensus between the parent/guardian/teacher/administration is met. The Kindergarten Readiness Assessment (post-test) will not be administered. The English Language Proficiency Test (ELPT) will not be administered. 	
1st and 2nd Grades	 Students in 1st and 2nd grades will be promoted to the next grade level if they have attained 70% mastery of the standards (denoted by an S or N) in English/Language Arts (ELA) and Math for the year. The minimum reading level of an I for 1st grade and an M for 2nd grade will not be considered for promotion or retention. Students mastering less than 70% of the standards in English/Language Arts or Math will be retained if a consensus between the parent/guardian/teacher/administration is met. 	

	• •	The I-Ready Universal Screener (post-test) will not be administered. The English Language Proficiency Test (ELPT) will not be administered.

RCSD Secondary Grading and Promotion Procedures for Distance Learning

- The purpose of both the online and technology-free assignments is to provide continuous educational opportunities and practice for students while schools are closed.
- During the school closure, teachers will provide distance learning assignments created by the teachers and/or the Secondary Curriculum Department through both online and technology free access.
- Lessons will be assigned weekly. Lessons will be provided through Canvas and/or Zoom for those with technology
 access or technology-free alternative lessons/assignments will be available through each school site with
 telephone support from teacher as needed.
- Assignments will not reflect negatively on the student's academic record but can improve your yearly average.
- Students can earn up to 10 points to be added to their yearly average by completing the distance learning assignments. (See Secondary Grading Procedures chart below.)
- A Zoom Parent/Guardian Consent and Release for Video/Audio Conferencing during COVID-19 School Closure Form will be sent to each parent via technology or paper copy to be signed before a student can participate in video/audio instruction.
- Online assignments will be monitored and recorded weekly. Timely feedback should be given on any assignment completed, but grades will not be assigned or recorded. **We will assign COMPLETE or INCOMPLETE.**
- Students will be provided ample time to complete assignments.

- All technology free assignments (paper copies) will be collected when students return and checked for completion. Again, please keep all completed assignments to be turned in when school resumes or on a date designated by the principal.
- Credit will be given for the assignments completed.
 - PowerSchool- shows COLLECTED (NO assigned numerical grades at this time)
 - o Canvas shows COMPLETED (NO assigned numerical grades at this time)
- An "Incomplete" will be given for those assignments NOT completed until school resumes.
- Feedback will be provided as appropriate to let the student know the assignment has been received and to help students focus on what they are doing well and what they can improve on.
- The EXCEPTION is Dual Credit courses. Follow direction from Hinds Community College.

Secondary Promotion and Retention Procedures

6th (BMS & FMS) - 8th Grade Non-Carnegie Unit Courses	Scores of 60 or more in math and English/Language Arts again will promote them to the next grade.
7th - 12th Grade Carnegie Unit Courses	Scores of 60 or more in Carnegie Unit courses will earn the Carnegie Unit.
Algebra I, Biology I, English II, and U.S. History students	Algebra I, Biology I, English II, and U.S. History end-of-course assessments will not be given. If a student in those courses passes the course, they won't have to pass the assessment for graduation. If a student has passed the course but not the assessment, they won't have to pass the assessment in order to graduate.

NOTE - Dual Credit courses will follow the requirements set by Hinds Community College.
